This 1972 Block T planting of clone 22 Pinot Noir has rewarded both winemakers and wine drinkers over the years, and every vintage it seems to come up with a new flavor or texture. 2012 was definitely a riper than normal year at Bien Nacido, and the resulting wine also has quite a bit of structure and depth. Of the three years Sandler has been working with Bien Nacido, 2010 was the ripest in flavor, due to the massive August/September heat wave, 2011 was the lightest and most aromatic, due to the cool growing season, and 2012 is somewhere in between. The aromas are more earthy and mushroom-like than they are fruity, but the density on the palate shows off the warm growing year of 2012. This is a Pinot built for aging, and it should last at least 12 years.
